October 7, 2019

A regular meeting of Council took place on the above date with the following members in attendance: Mayor Brazil, Deputy Mayor Stamp, Councillors T Smith, D Smith, Jewer, Lundrigan and Town Manager Tony Ryan. Visitors included Howard Smith, Jackie Coombs, Sheldon Coombs, John Drover, Dave Gosse, Carol Smith, and Robert Lundrigan. Mayor Brazil called the meeting to order at 7:09 pm and welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Motion to Adopt Agenda

The agenda for the October 7, 2019 meeting was tabled.

Councillor Tracy Smith asked to have and item added to the Planning Committee 6 B 3 Delaney's Crescent workshop.

It was moved by Councillor Jewer, seconded by Councillor Lundrigan, to adopt the Agenda of October 7, 2019 as amended.

Petitions and/or Visiting Groups

A) Letter regarding Crown land Application & Residential Permit

A letter was tabled from Rodney White & Wanda Mercer. Ms. Wanda Mercer stated that Town has denied their application for property through Crown lands. Mayor Brazil stated that the letter provided to Crown lands was an approval but stated that in order for the resident to build a home the land had to be re-zoned from Rural to Residential. There was a general discussion regarding this application and re-zoning. Mayor Brazil stated that the Town Plan is currently under review and that the Town Manager has included this parcel of land to be included in the re-zoning process.

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Stamp, seconded by Councillor T. Smith, to strike the comments pertaining to other residents in the area from the letter that has no bearing on this topic.

B) Signage at Ryan's Road

A letter was tabled from Mr. Robert Lundrigan of 13-15 Ryan's Road to request Council to reassess his application for road signs from 2018. The resident stated that

there are a lot of people who access Ryan's Brook via Ryan's Road and use the paved segment for parking, he stated that he does not have clear access to his own driveway. He requested for Council to erect 'No Parking' signs on the opposite side of the road across from his driveway. Council agreed that signage across from his driveway would make sense.

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Stamp and seconded by Councillor Lundrigan that two signs be erected across from Mr. Robert Lundrigan's driveway that state" No parking between Sign".

Town Manager's Report

- 1. To the best of our knowledge there are no leaks outstanding.
- 2. We need to replace the fence that runs along the depot property and the residents as CB hwy to the front. This is approximately 160 Ft in length. I need a motion to begin work on this project.
- 3. The roof, doors and siding project at the Municipal Depot has been completed
- 4. Seal and Save Ltd. has advised that a vertical siding would look much better on this building because of the length. What is Council's opinion on this? Colors to remain as previously selected. Grove for siding color and northern ash for the brick/rock. I need a motion to proceed with the vertical or is Council of the opinion that horizontal is the way to go.
- 5. We are preparing to receive sand and salt to mix for the upcoming winter season. Will need to advise the fire department not to accept any more car wrecks for the Jaws of Life training until after this process is completed
- 6. 2020 Budget process is ongoing.

Planning Committee

Duplex at 22-24 Brown's Road

An application for a permit to build a Duplex on Brown's Rd was referred to the Planning Committee at the September 16 meeting. Councillor T Smith stated that no decision has been reached yet as one of the members of the Planning Committee is away. She stated that the Planning Committee should have a recommendation to bring back to the next regular meeting of Council.

Woodworking Shop at 3 Delaney's Crescent

An Application was tabled to run a woodworking shop at 3 Delaneys Crescent at the September 16, 2019 meeting and was referred to the Planning Committee for review and recommendation back to council. The applicant was advised that it falls under discretionary use under the town plan, so they must advertise to the public. Mayor Brazil declared a Conflict of Interest on this matter in accordance with Section 207(1)(c) of the Municipalities Act as the applicant is his brother in law. He left the meeting at 7:46 pm. Deputy Mayor Stamp took the Chair.

The applicant had a notice in the Compass to apply under the discretionary use under the Town Plan and no submissions came forth in favour of or against.

It was moved by Councillor T. Smith, seconded by Councillor Jewer, to approve the application to open a new workshop at 3 Delaney's Crescent in accordance to the provisions of the Town of Spaniard's Bay Development Regulations and/or all other applicable provincial and federal regulations.

Finance Committee

<u>Animal Control Officer - Wages</u>

A letter was tabled at the September 16, 2019 meeting from the Animal Control Officer requesting review of his wages. It was referred to the Finance Committee for review and recommendation back to Council. Council recommends a \$1.00 per hour increase up to a maximum of \$10 per week, pending approval from Clarke's Beach and North River for their input on wage increases from their towns.

It was moved Deputy Mayor Stamp, seconded by Councillor Jewer, to increase the Animal Control Officers salary by \$1.00 per hour up to a maximum of \$10.00 per week conditional on Clarke's Beach and North River contributing an amount proportional to their share per week.

Resident of Anthony's Rd -Connection Fee

A letter was tabled from a resident of Anthony's Road requesting to have fees for water and sewer connection waved.

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Stamp, seconded by Councillor Jewer, that the request be denied for waiver of fees for a new water and sewer connection to 66 Anthony's Road.

Heritage Committee

A letter and quote was tabled from the Heritage Society requesting funds to repair/restore the Heritage building Brook. Mayor Brazil stated that the Heritage Committee obtained a quote in the amount of \$7475.00. A project of this size would need to be sent for bids/quotes. Council recommended they apply for grants and have this project added to Heritage "wish list" to be considered in the 2020 Budget and referred to Finance Committee for review and recommendation.

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Stamp, seconded by Councillor Jewer, to have the request for repairs to the brook by Heritage Building referred to Finance Committee for review and recommendation back to council.

Motion to amend Motion of August 28, 2019 meeting

A letter was tabled at August 28, 2019 Special Meeting in regards to the current turn around on Chipman's Road. A motion to amend the motion of August 28,2018 to reflect that relocation of a turnaround would be considered as the area is developed for the turn around to be located at the last house.

It was moved by Councillor Jewer, seconded By Councillor T. Smith to amend the motion of the August 28, 2019 meeting which stated "that the resident be written and advised that Unfortunately Council is not in a position to accept your request at this time. The property identified on the survey provided was used as a turn around for a number of years. When the Town ran a sewer line project through the area the turnaround was cleaned up and put into the condition as it appears today. This work

was done during a period that although there was a name on the property for municipal records purposes, there were no deeds available to verify property ownership and at one point, was even considered property of the Crown." to include "as development moves beyond the point of the current turnaround, Council will be receptive to have it relocated to the end of the development (last house) as have been done previously. In these cases, the property developer will be required to undertake bringing the road up to an acceptable condition and to provide the turnaround suitable for snow clearing equipment, garbage collection and emergency equipment to be able to turn safely. Once those conditions are met, Council will have no further use for the previous turnaround."

2020 Municipal Works Applications

Municipal Capital Works Program

The following is a list of priorities recommended as a guide for applying for funding for the Municipal Capital Works. Priorities are in order as listed

- **1.Pondside Rd, Tilton -** Area to include from intersection at Back Track to the Basketball Court near the last hydrant
- **2.Rectory Avenue-Casey's Lane, Annie's Lane -** Commonly referred to as the Loop **3.Cemetery Road, Tilton -** Road leading to the graveyard in Tilton. This road intersects with Back Track at both ends.
- **4.Wastewater Treatment** This project may shift along the priority list depending on the availability of provincial and/or federal funding. We are unable to provide an estimate at this time.

1)Pondside Road, Tilton

It was moved by Councillor Jewer, seconded Deputy Mayor Stamp, that the Town make application under the Municipal Capital Works Program to complete upgrading and paving at Pondside Road(priority #1) for the 2020 construction season
